Acts 3:18-21

18 In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. 19 Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out, 20 so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, and that he may send the Messiah appointed for you, that is, Jesus, 21 who must remain in heaven until the time of universal restoration that God announced long ago through his holy prophets.

The city and its dimensions	
 There is a "structure like a city" (40:2) with defined measurements for its length, width, and circumference (48:15-16, 35) 	 The holy city, the new Jerusalem, comes down from heaven from God (21:2; cf. 21:10) with defined measurements for its length, width, <i>and height</i>
The city gates (and wall and foundations)	
• There are three gates on each of the four sides of the city, each named for one of the twelve tribes (48:30-34)	• There are three gates on each of the four sides of the city, each named for one of the twelve tribes (21:12-13). <i>The gates are made of pearls (and the streets of gold)</i> (21:19-21).
• The outer gate of the sanctuary shall remain shut (44:1-2), and the gate of the inner court that faces east is closed every day except for the Sabbath and the day of the new moon (46:1)	• <i>The gates are never shut</i> (21:25).
	• There are twelve foundations to the city wall, each named for one of the twelve apostles (21:14). <i>The foundations are made of specified jewels</i> (21:19-21).
The Temple:	
 Zadokite priests (48:11-12) have charge of it (40:45) It has a most holy place (41:4) and a table before the LORD (41:22) 	• There is no temple for the LORD and the Lamb are the temple (21:22)
 The LORD's glory fills the temple (43:5; 44:4) 	
Inhabitants of the city:	
 The tribes of Israel, resident aliens (47:13-14, 21-23, 48:1-7, 23-29), Zadokites (48:11-12), Levites (48:13-14), and "the prince" (48:21-22) have land allotments; the tribes are city workers (48:19); and while the LORD will "reside among the people of Israel forever" (43:7), allowing "foreigners" into the sanctuary is an "abomination" (44:7; cf. 44:9). 	• <i>The nations</i> will walk by God's light and <i>the kings of the earth</i> will bring their glory into the city (21:24; cf. 21:26).

No defilement	
• When the glory of the LORD returns, Israel shall no longer defile the LORD's holy name (43:7) Water	• Nothing unclean (21:27) or accursed (22:3), no abomination or falsehood, will enter the city (21:27)
 Water flows out from the temple (47:1-2). It is fresh water so that "everything," particularly many kinds of fish, "will live where the river goes" (47:9-10) 	 Water flows from the throne of God and the Lamb through the middle of the city (22:1) <i>This is the river of the water of life, bright as a crystal</i> (22:1)
 There are many trees on the river bank (47:7) that will bear fresh fruit every month; the leaves are for healing (47:12). 	 On the river banks are <i>the tree of life</i> (22:2) with twelve kinds of fruit producing fruit each month the leaves are for <i>the healing of the nations</i> (22:2)
Access to God While the name of the city is "The LORD is there" (48:35), seemingly only the priests shall come near to the LORD (44:15) Other 	• "God himself will be with them" (21:3), meaning that <i>seeming all of God's servants will see</i> <i>His face and His name will be on their foreheads</i> (22:4).
	"Death will be no more; / mourning and crying and pain will be no more" (21:4) There is no sun or moon for God's glory is its light and the Lamb its lamp (21:23; cf. 22:5). There is no night (22:5).
