Trustworthiness and Affection: 1 Thessalonians 2

1 Thess 2

¹ You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, ² but though we had already suffered and been shamefully mistreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. ³ For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, ⁴ but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. ⁵ As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; ⁶ nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, ⁷ though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. ⁸ So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.

⁹ You remember our labor and toil, brothers and sisters; we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you while we proclaimed to you the gospel of God. ¹⁰ You are witnesses, and God also, how pure, upright, and blameless our conduct was toward you believers. ¹¹ As you know, we dealt with each one of you like a father with his children, ¹² urging and encouraging you and pleading that you lead a life worthy of God, who calls you into his own kingdom and glory.

¹³ We also constantly give thanks to God for this, that when you received the word of God that you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word but as what it really is, God's word, which is also at work in you believers. ¹⁴ For you, brothers and sisters, became imitators of the churches of God in Christ Jesus that are in Judea, for you suffered the same things from your own compatriots as they did from the Jews, ¹⁵ who killed both the Lord Jesus and the prophets, and drove us out; they displease God and oppose everyone ¹⁶ by hindering us from speaking to the Gentiles so that they may be saved. Thus they have constantly been filling up the measure of their sins; but God's wrath has overtaken them at last.

¹⁷ As for us, brothers and sisters, when, for a short time, we were made orphans by being separated from you—in person, not in heart—we longed with great eagerness to see you face to face. ¹⁸ For we wanted to come to you—certainly I, Paul, wanted to again and again—but Satan blocked our way. ¹⁹ For what is our hope or joy or crown of boasting before our Lord Jesus at his coming? Is it not you? ²⁰ Yes, you are our glory and joy!

A. Trustworthiness

1 For you know, brothers, that our coming to you was **not** in vain #1 2 **But** despite suffering in Philippi—as <u>you know</u>—we boldly brought you, in God, the gospel despite much opposition 3 For our appeal was **not** from error **nor** impurity **nor** trickery 4 but as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, we speak #2 **not** seeking to please men **but** seeking to please God who tests our hearts. 5 For we did **not** come with flattery—as you know—**nor** with a pretext for greed 6 nor seeking praise from men (you or others) #3 7 (though we might have been a burden as apostles of Christ) **but** we came gently among you, like a nurse caring for her own children. 8 So deeply do we care for you that we thought it good to share **not only** the gospel of God #4 **but also** our very selves because you have become very dear to us.

9 For you remember, brothers,

our labor and toil: night and day we worked so as not to burden any of you while we proclaimed to you the gospel of God.

10 You are witnesses—and so is God—

how holy and righteous and blameless we were to you believers,

11 — as you know — how like a father with his children, each one of you 12 urging and encouraging you and witnessing that you might walk worthy of the God who calls you into His kingdom and glory.

B. Love

- 1. Array of overlapping images for himself... mother, father, orphan
 - ...coupled with repeated familial language for them: "brothers" (5x: 1:4; 2:1, 9, 14, 17)
 - ...and repeated language of "beloved" for them (1:4)
- 2. Overfull language of constancy: we always give thanks for all of you constantly
- 3. Effusive language of desire and affection:
 - -So deeply do we are, we share ourselves, because you have become dear to us (2:8)
 - -Greatly eager, to see you face-to-face, united-in-heart, orphans without you! (2:17)
 - -Wanted to come to you, again and again (2:18)
 - -You are our hope, joy, crown-of-boasting, glory, and joy! (2:19)
- 4. Structure: an extended (2 chapter!) "thanksgiving" for their specific gifts and story
